Your Weatherby rifle is a precision firearm manufac tured of the finest materials and has been thoroughly inspected and tested in every phase of production. It is warranted to be free of defects in material and workmanship under normal use and service for a period of twelve months from the date of purchase. This warranty shall not apply to defects resulting from accident, misuse or alteration by unauthorized persons. This warranty shall also be void if any other than factory loaded ammunition is fired in it. If your rifle fails due to a defect in original workmanship or materials, all necessary repairs will be made providing the firearm is returned to Weatherby, Inc., transportation prepaid, and it is deemed defective upon the inspection of our gunsmiths. Rifles must be accompanied by letter explaining nature of defect. This warranty applies only to the original nurchaser.

stack: The distinctively shaped stacks on the Westherty Mark V fifths have become the "new standard" in styling the sords over, Each is made of the finest woods available and finished by a new treating and coating process giving you more rugged durability than any other finish known. Every Westherby Mark V is paintskingly hand bedded to assure you precision accuracy, is equipped with Westherby receip Jack Research point give you with traditional Westherby with squares, and hand-clocked put skilled artisants within squares, and hand-clocked put skilled artisants.

#### DIRECTIONS FOR OPERATING

to assemble The bolt of your Weatherby Mark V rifle is packed bolt to separately in the shipping carton. Fit forward end of receiver: bolt into the receiver, pull trigger back as far as possible, and slide bolt partially forward in receiver. Then, rotate bolt right or left until bolt ston engages the groove on the under side of the bolt, and complete insertion and locking of bolt in receiver.

loading: (Important, before loading your rifle, always be sure there are no obstructions in the barrel such as grease, dirt, patches, etc.) With bolt open, lay cartridge on magazine follower, and press into magazine until held by side walls. The magazine of your Weatherby Mark V will hold three? Weatherby magnum cartridges. An extra cartridge may then be loaded directly into the chamber by holding down the top cartridge in the magazine and closing the bolt on the chambered cartridge.

safety: The safety, which is located on the right side of the bolt sleeve, cannot be operated unless the firing pin is cocked. To engage, move safety as far back as it will go covering red dot. This disengages the sear from the trigger and locks the bolt handle in the



to fire: Push safety forward exposing red dot, and pull trigger to fire, (fig. 1)

To remove live cartridge from the chamber, open bolt and pull bolt rearward slowly until the cartridge can ceiver. To remove cartridges from the magazine, open hinged floor plate by depressing the button in front of trigger-guard and cartridges will drop out.

#### SUGGESTIONS FOR GETTING TOP PERFORMANCE FROM YOUR WEATHERBY MARK V

Your Weatherby Mark V is guaranteed to be accurate
with Weatherby factory ammunition. This guarantee
is supported by test firing each rifle at the factory.
Ammunition used is the same high quality Weatherby ammunition available at your Weatherby dealer. It

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- ulating actual field conditions. Remember, for best results always use Weatherby factory loaded ammunition.
- 2. Make sure that both trigger guard screws are tight before firing your rifle. Always tighten the front guard screw first and the rear screw last. Loose trigger guard screws not only contribute to inaccuracy but can also cause stock damage. Check these screws periodically as recoil and changes in atmospheric conditions, can cause them to work loose.
- Be sure your scope is secure. Loose mount screws are a definite source of inaccuracy. If your scope was mounted at our factory, you may be sure the mounting screws will "stay put" as they were treated with a special thread-seafer that resists receil without source.
- 4. If there should ever occur a noticeable change in point of impact or opining of groups, and you have checked all the above sources of inaccuracy, it is possible that there has been a slight disension change in the stock due to atmospheric variations. (This can happen to any wood stock no matter how well sealed.) The remety is usually minor rebedding of the barrel. Consult the factory before returning the

If you anticipate a hunt in extremely cold weather, where temperatures sometimes reach 50 degrees below zero, you should send your bolt to our factory for winterizing. Any trace of lubricants will be removed and replaced with a special graphite.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR CARE AND

Weatherby Magnum ammunition is completely noncorrosive and cannot harm your rifle's bore. However, moisture can form in the bore and this can cause rust if left unattended.

It is just good sense and a simple precaution after fifting for run a patch seaked with a powder solvent through the bore, then a dry patch followed by a lightly older patch. Heavy greates should be used only if the fiftile is to be stored for a long period and, of course, should always be removed before firing, in cleaning the bore, it is highly advisable to remove both and insert rod from breech. (Be sure rifle is unloaded before starting cleaning.)

The action and all metal parts should be cleaned off after exposure to rain or dempness and even after being handled. (Perspiral or dempness are very corrosive Wipe off parts, such as both can over very corrosive with a slightly oily cloth. To insure amount parts with a slightly oily cloth. To protect bore while hunting in rain or dust, cover the muzzle with Scotch tape. Rifle may be fired without removing tape. Tape should always be removed from the rifle after the hunt. Never plug muzzle with any obstruction during storage.
